This past summer AAUW of AL held its first Leadership Summit (training) in many years.

Tuscaloosa was a great host group, considering that they had just reinstated their branch. The information given by our workshop leaders and group sessions was great. I just wish that more of you had come to hear it as this was designed to give leaders tools to work at the local level.



At the summit we elected Angelia Bendolph as the Communication Director and appointed Courtney Chism as the Younger Members Chair as unfortunately the women who were in those positions moved out of the state.

Also this summer UAH and the Huntsville branch held a Tech Trek week long camp for about 60 incoming eighth grade girls from all over Alabama. It was a wonderful experience for them.

All of us should be membership ambassadors. At the moment there are about 400 members listed on the AAUW books for our nine branches. It would be great to recruit younger members for our branches. They can bring new blood and energy to the groups. Make a conscious effort to talk up AAUW to others.

In addition to our branches we have three student groups, at Athens State, UA and UAB. But others could be formed at college campuses. There is also a an Younger Women's Task Force group in the Tuscaloosa area.


The next state convention will be in Florence on April 8-10. Please put that on your calendar now. More details about this will be in a future newsletter.

## UPDATE FROM AAUW ALABAMA C/U RELATIONS CHAIR

The role of the C/U Relations Chair is to share information about AAUW programming, scholarship, and initiatives with our C/U Partners. As of October 2015, Alabama has twelve C/U Partners across the state from University of North Alabama in Muscle Shoals to the University of South Alabama in Mobile. My goal is to expand membership by bringing more colleges and universities into our C/U Partnership network. Discussions are underway with Central Alabama Community College and Miles College to establish new C/U Partnerships.

Since I was asked to step in the role of Alabama AAUW C/U Relations Chair last November, I've been encouraged to learn of activities on our partner campuses. The University of South Alabama helped to welcome leadership, members, and student affiliates to the AAUW Alabama state meeting in March.

The University of Alabama was selected by the AAUW national office to provide an Elect Her-Campus Women Win training workshop to prepare young women to confidently run for leadership in student government organizations. Samford University hosted a Conversations for a Cause focused on the representation of women in leadership positions on campus. The University of North Alabama held a bake sale to bring attention to the gender pay gap selling brownies and cookies to females for 77 cents and charging males one dollar for a baked treat. Provost Linda Lucas shared her AAUW story as the keynote speaker at a Convos for a Cause luncheon at the University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB).

The next UAB Convos for a Cause featured a panel on Campus Safety highlighting the Campus Sexual Violence Elimination (SaVe) Act in November. The University of Alabama in Huntsville brought 65 seventh and eighth grade girls to campus in June for TechTrek Alabama 2015. A recent meeting with Birmingham Southern has affirmed a campus commitment to AAUW.

AAUW Alabama funded two students' registration and travel to attend the National Conference of College Women Student Leaders (NCCWSL) in College Park, MD in May. Our common efforts support AAUW's mission nationwide by educating the next generation of women ready to take the lead advocating for gender equity.

In the coming months, I will continue working to expand the number of C/U Partner campuses in our state and asking our C/U Representatives at our partner campuses to nominate young women to serve on an Alabama AAUW Student Advisory Council.
